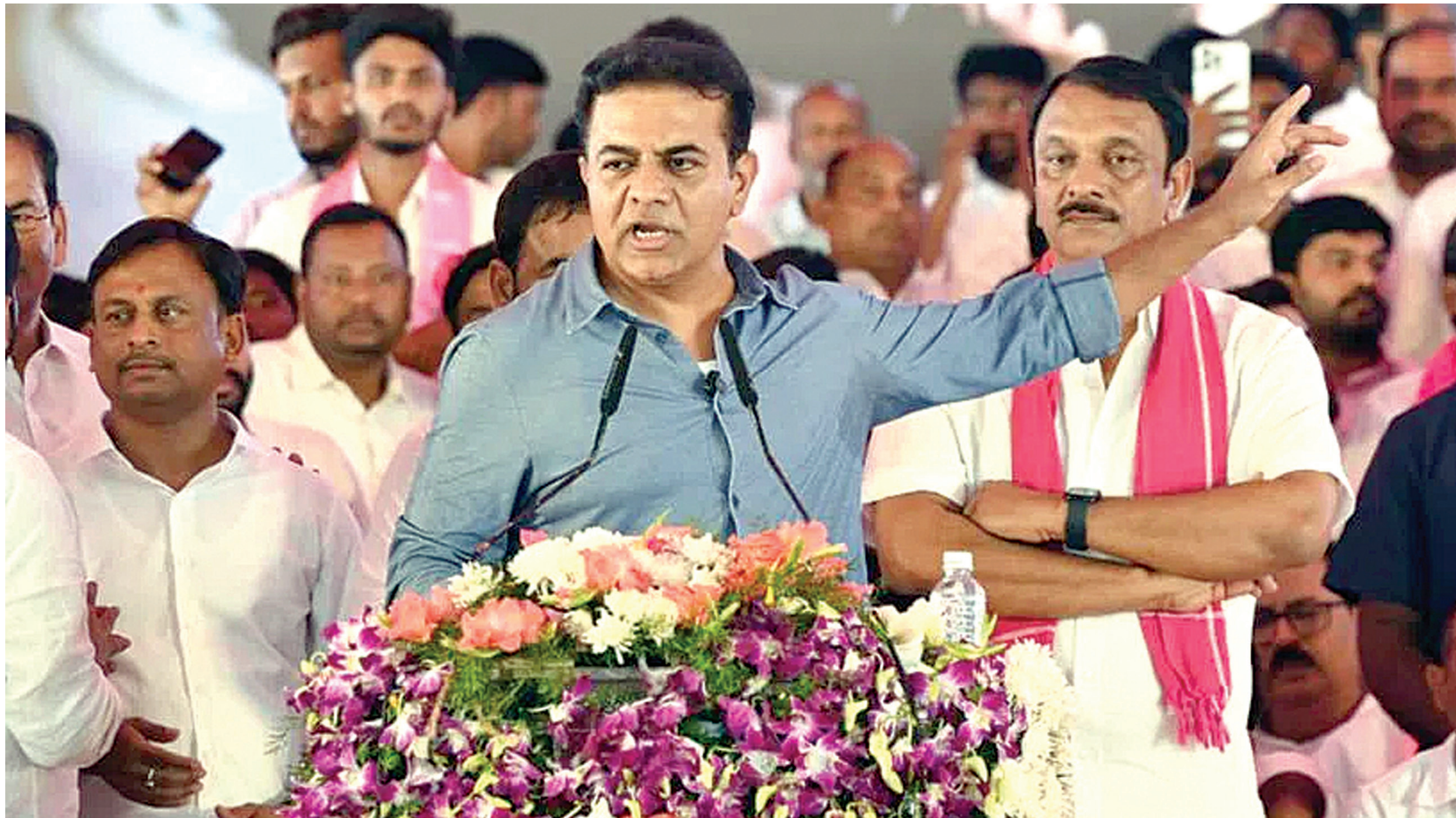


YOUTH BETRAYED, CLAIMS KTR

KTR THROWS OPEN CHALLENGE TO CHIEF MINISTER REVANTH REDDY

BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) on Saturday challenged Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy to substantiate the Congress government's claim of providing 70,000 government jobs in Telangana, asserting that he would retire from politics if the claim was proven true.

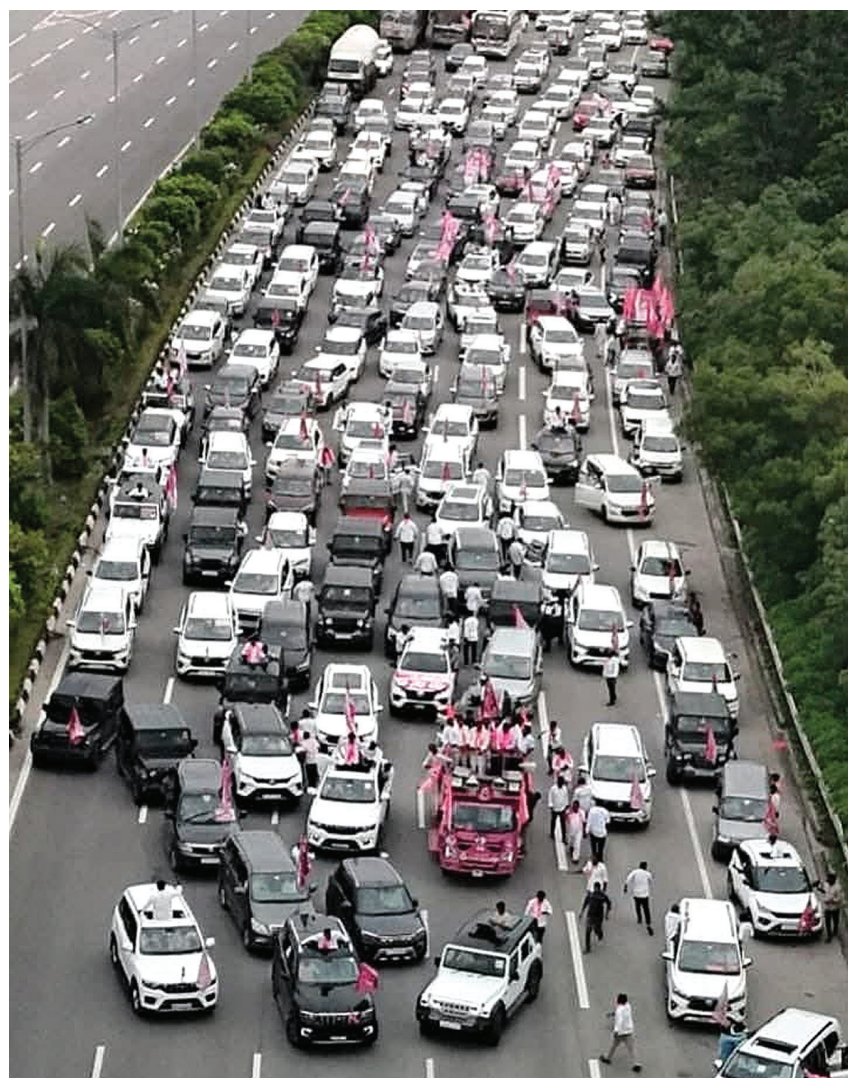
Addressing the BRS Yuva Sangrama Sadassu at Saroornagar Stadium in Hyderabad, KTR alleged that the Congress government had failed to fulfill the promises made in its Youth Declaration released before the 2023 Assembly elections. He recalled that the government had informed the Assembly that only 16,978 vacancies had been filled in various departments and questioned the basis of the claim regarding 70,000 jobs.

KTR accused the Congress of misleading unemployed youth with promises such as two lakh government jobs within a year, a monthly unemployment allowance of ₹4,000, electric scooters for students, the formation of a Youth Commission, and interest-free loans up to ₹10 lakh. He claimed that none of these assurances had been implemented since the party came to power.

During his speech, KTR played videos of Congress leaders, including Rahul Gandhi, Priyanka Gandhi, and Revanth Reddy, highlighting commitments made to young voters before the elections. He questioned whether the government had delivered on those promises and alleged that Congress leaders were now distancing themselves from their earlier assurances.

The BRS leader further criticized the absence of a comprehensive job calendar, stating that despite repeated assurances, recruitment notifications for several vacancies had not been issued. Referring to demands from police job aspirants, he alleged that the government was neglecting the concerns of unemployed youth.

Claiming that Telangana had witnessed "lootification instead of job notifications," KTR said the Congress government had disappointed the younger generation and failed to meet their aspirations. He asserted that the youth of Telangana were becoming increasingly disillusioned with the government's performance.



The Yuva Sangrama Sadassu was organized by the BRS to highlight what the party described as the Congress government's failure to implement the promises made to the youth before the Assembly elections. KTR urged young voters and their families to assess the government's performance and hold it accountable for its commitments.
