



"MAKE IN INDIA HAS BECOME LEAK IN INDIA": KTR

HYDERABAD, July 25: Launching a scathing attack on the Narendra Modi-led Union government over alleged examination paper leaks and the handling of student protests, BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) declared that India's youth have lost patience with unfulfilled promises and are now leading a nationwide movement demanding accountability. Addressing a massive youth and student protest organised by the BRSV at Indira Park in Hyderabad on Friday, KTR said the country's Gen Z is no longer willing to remain silent in the face of injustice and government failures.

KTR accused the Centre of betraying the aspirations of millions of young Indians by failing to deliver on promises of employment and educational reforms. He said the government had promised two crore jobs every year but instead presided over repeated examination paper leaks that have jeopardised the futures of countless students. Taking a swipe at the Centre's flagship "Make in India" initiative, he remarked that it has now become "Leak in India."

The BRS leader said the anger among the youth extends far beyond examination paper leaks and reflects twelve years of broken promises and a lack of accountability. According to him, students and young people across the country are demanding answers from the government and are questioning why their futures continue to be compromised. He alleged that instead of addressing genuine grievances, the government has sought to suppress dissent and malign protesting students.

Referring to the ongoing protests in Delhi, KTR criticised the alleged police action against students and questioned why Prime Minister Narendra Modi has remained silent on their demands. He said students are not asking for positions of power but are simply demanding justice, transparency and protection of their future. He condemned attempts to portray protesting students as anti-national elements and urged the Centre to engage with them through dialogue rather than intimidation.

KTR further stated that India's Gen Z represents a new political and social force that cannot be silenced through fear or coercion. He noted that today's youth are politically aware, digitally connected and capable of mobilising nationwide support through social media. He



argued that the emergence of youth-led movements without political backing is a clear indication that young Indians are increasingly unwilling to tolerate systemic failures in education and governance.

He also criticised what he described as selective political responses to student issues

and alleged that governments at both the Centre and the state have failed to adequately address the concerns of young people. Calling for comprehensive reforms in the education sector, KTR demanded accountability for examination irregularities, withdrawal of cases against protesting students and the

resignation of those responsible for the failures.

Expressing solidarity with the student movement, KTR assured that the BRS leadership would continue to support democratic protests seeking justice for students. He urged young people to remain

united and independent in their struggle and cautioned them against allowing their movement to be hijacked by political interests. He reiterated that the fight must continue until meaningful reforms are implemented and justice is delivered to the affected students across the country.

A Win for Democratic Protest: Dasoju Sravan

HYDERABAD, July 25 (Vishwam News): BRS MLC Dr. Dasoju Sravan hailed the resignation of Union Education Minister Dharmendra Pradhan as a landmark victory for the student movement, stating that collective student consciousness and democratic struggle have once again proved stronger than political arrogance and authoritarian governance. He said that no government, irrespective of its power or political dominance, can afford to ignore the voices of questioning and awakened youth.

Describing the development as a triumph of youth power, Dasoju Sravan said that when students and young people unite for a just cause, even the highest seats of authority are compelled to

respond. He noted that the resignation serves as a powerful reminder that governments must remain accountable to the aspirations and concerns of the younger generation. According to him, the growing student movement has demonstrated that democratic institutions are ultimately answerable to the people they serve.

The BRS leader remarked that the episode sends a strong message against arrogance in governance. Had the concerns of students been addressed in time and with sincerity, the situation would never have escalated to this point, he said. Ignoring the anguish of students and failing to resolve their grievances, he added, has resulted in political

embarrassment for those in power.

Dasoju Sravan further stated that today's youth are well-informed, socially conscious, and deeply aware of their constitutional rights and future prospects. In an era driven by knowledge and awareness, authoritarian tendencies cannot withstand the collective voice of educated young citizens. When students take to the streets seeking justice and transparency, governments are left with no option but to listen and act, he observed.

He cautioned policymakers against treating the future of students casually and urged governments to ensure complete transparency, integrity, and accountability within the education system. Educational policies and examination processes, he

said, must inspire confidence among students rather than create uncertainty and distrust.

Calling for sustained vigilance, Dasoju Sravan asserted that the student movement would continue until meaningful reforms are implemented and the rights and interests of students are fully protected. He emphasised that the resignation should not be viewed as the conclusion of the struggle but as the beginning of greater accountability in educational governance.

Concluding his statement, he said, "This is not the end. The fight for students' rights and educational justice will continue. Jai Student Unity! Jai Youth Power!"
